
Our Puppetry Club

During the workshop children experienced different kinds of scents and explored their feelings and ideas to then use them to create a story.





To celebrate the end of this long term and to reward the children for their hard work and various achievements, we organised an amazing visit to the school by **Animal Experience**. This is a group of qualified experts specialised in teaching about the animals they bring into school (from a boa over a metre long to meerkats and from cockroaches to a blue-tongued skink as well as others!). All the children, from Nursery to Year 3, (as well as the staff) had the opportunity to learn about the animals, their natural environments, their lives and to get up close and see and hold animals they may never have seen before.
